We cannot clearly state which of the active learning activities are responsible for the clearly evident increase in student grades and a reduction in fail rates. However, the overall implementation of a variety of active learning strategies simultaneously improved academic outcomes for students, as previously evidenced by others (8, 9, 11, 17).

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Examples of Active Learning Strategies (adapted from California State University’s “Active Learning for the College Classroom,” by Paulson & Faust): Individual Activities: The “One Minute Paper” – This is a highly effective technique for checking student progress, both in understanding the material and in reacting to course material.

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Eighty-seven percent of the responders utilized at least one technique of active learning. Active learning was used more frequently by female responders. For example, 54.30% of the female responders reported using learning by teaching as one of their teaching methods compared to 41.30% of their male counterparts (p = 0.0005).
