For understandable reasons the Platonic dialogues focus on poetry, and with special energy on dramatic poetry. Tragedy and comedy were culturally dominant art forms during Socrates' lifetime and much of Plato's.

The word is Greek and means "imitation" (though in the sense of "re-presentation" rather than of "copying"). Plato and Aristotle spoke of mimesis as the re-presentation of nature. According to Plato, all artistic creation is a form of imitation: that which really exists (in the "world of ideas") is a

type created by God; the concrete things man perceives in his existence are shadowy representations of this ideal type.
