The Pain Assessment in Advanced Dementia Scale (PAINAD) scale has proven to be a reliable tool for pain evaluation in dementia patients. The original study defines scores between 0 and 10, where 0 means "no pain" and 10 means "severe pain".

Assessment Scales In Advanced Dementia

The purpose of an assessment scale is to increase the precision of a decision by reducing subjectivity and increasing objectivity; for example, using a cognitive screening test score to screen for underlying dementia, to distinguish impairment due to dementia from normal age-related cognitive change or to monitor the effects of treatment of dementia in a clinic or controlled trial.

The tool, Pain Assessment in Advanced Dementia (PAINAD), was compared with the Discomfort Scale and two visual analog scales (discomfort and pain) by trained raters/expert clinicians in the development study, and used for detection of analgesic efficacy in a quality improvement activity.
