It is scored using complex manual scoring, with most scales scored using a multi-point system. Score interpretations are organised in an hierarchical structure. Both Core and Diagnostic scales can be interpreted individually or Core scales can be clustered to measure Verbal Ability, Pictorial Reasoning Ability and Spatial Ability.

Currently into its second edition (DAS-II), the test can be administered to children ages 2 years 6 months to 17 years 11 months across a range of developmental levels.

Assessment with the Differential Ability Scales

Differential Ability Scales including pictures recalled two or three times. Recall of Objects-Delayed: trying to recall the pictures again on a surprise retest 15 to 20 minutes later. Speed of Information Processing: the student scans rows of figures or numbers and marks the figure with the most parts or the greatest number in each row. The score is based on speed.

Aylward and Reinchr have rightly observed that complexity of the administration and scoring procedures of the Differential Ability Scales may obstruct its widespread usage in the applied environment. Furthermore, the DAS is a comparatively new scale which needs a lot of research and feeding before it can prove its importance in the job market as well as in the clinical atmosphere.

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
