Growing Chamomile From Seeds . Chamomile seeds should be started indoors 6-8 weeks before the last frost date in springtime. Sow seeds 1/4-inch deep in seed starting soil. Keep the soil moist and warm, around 70°F. You need to be patient with chamomile because it takes 14-21 days to germinate.

Meanwhile, the main culture of the medicinal plants and spices cultivated in Germany is True chamomile. The annual cultivation area amounts to more than 800 ha, more than 700 ha thereof are to be found in Thuringia. Other German cultivation areas are Saxony (about 40 ha organically grown chamomile) and Hesse (approximately 100 ha).
