Death with dignity laws, also known as physician-assisted dying or aid-in-dying laws, stem from the basic idea that it is the terminally ill people, not government and its interference, politicians and their ideology, or religious leaders and their dogma, who should make their end-of-life decisions and determine how much pain and suffering they should endure.

Any physician licensed to practice in a "death with dignity state" is allowed to participate if s/he agrees; the law also says every physician has the choice not to participate. Physician-assisted death is legal in California, Oregon, Washington, Vermont, Colorado and Montana. These states — with the exception of Montana, where it was made legal through a court ruling — have so-called "death with dignity" statutes. The District of Columbia recently legalized it as well.

Oregon (Death with Dignity Act) Oregon voters passed the Death with Dignity Act in 1994 with 51 percent of the vote, which allows terminally ill patients to obtain a prescription for lethal drugs. A ballot measure attempting to repeal the law lost (with 60 percent of voters opposed) in 1997, and was upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in 2006 .
