### Non-Suicidal self-injury and suicide in depressed ...

Using cross-sectional data of the children in the Guizhou Province of China, the present study examined the association between stressful life events and self-esteem, depression, and non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI). The participants included 1,210 children recruited from four junior high schools. Self-report questionnaires concerned stressful life events, self-esteem, depression, and NSSI.

Non-suicidal self-injury is typically used as a coping strategy for preserving and enhancing life, not ending one's life. However, since self-injury and suicide both indicate underlying distress it is important to assess whether self-injurious individuals are also suicidal and provide the necessary treatment for individuals in both of these categories.

### Self-injury/cutting - Symptoms and causes - Mayo Clinic

Self-injury involves self-inflicted, non-suicidal bodily harm that is severe enough to either cause tissue damage or to leave marks that last several hours. Cutting is the most common form of self-injury but burning, head banging, and scratching are also common.

Findings were broadly consistent in the imputed and complete case analysis. 38 (12%) of 310 participants with suicidal thoughts and 46 (12%) of 380 participants who had engaged in non-suicidal self-harm reported having attempted suicide for the first time by the follow-up at 21 years of age. 107 participants reported both suicidal thoughts and non-suicidal self-harm at 16 years of age.

Background: While prior research has demonstrated that peer victimization and bully perpetration contribute to non-suicidal self-injury (NSSI) and suicidal thoughts and behaviors (STBs), it remains unclear whether these interpersonal processes differentiate self-injuring adolescent suicide ideators and attempters.

### Depression and Non-Suicidal Self Injury

Non-Suicidal Self-injury . The International Society for the Study of Self-injury (ISSS) defines non-suicidal self-injury as "the deliberate, self-inflicted destruction of body tissue without suicidal intent and for purposes not socially sanctioned" (ISSS, 2007).

### OCD, Self Injury, and Suicidal Thoughts

Suicide and self-inflicted injuries was the third leading cause of premature death from injury or disease in 2015. The total years of life lost (YLL) due to suicide and self-inflicted injuries was estimated to be 134,100 years, behind coronary heart disease (262,000) and lung cancer (154,400).

**SOARS model: Risk assessment of nonsuicidal self-injury**

Nonsuicidal self-injury (NSSI), defined as the deliberate, self-inflicted destruction of body tissue without suicidal intent and for purposes not socially sanctioned, includes behaviors such as cutting, burning, biting and scratching skin [].NSSI is especially prevalent during adolescence with mean and pooled rates of 17–18% in recent reviews of community samples [2, 3].

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
