## Hyperlexia: Signs, Diagnosis, and Treatment

Dyslexia implies that a child is struggling to learn the basic principles of reading, despite being formally exposed. Hyperlexia means that a child has learned to read intuitively with little to no formal training. Both the dyslexic and the hyperlexic can be intellectually gifted; however, both are considered learning disabilities.

Hyperlexia Type 3: This type refers to a somewhat rare form of hyperlexia that is seen in combination with "autistic-like" symptoms that dissipate or fade in time as the person matures. You may see other precocious behaviors as well as reading very early or perhaps really intense sensory sensitivity (e.g., to sounds, touch or taste).

Hyperlexia. Hyperlexia has many characteristics similar to autism and some consider it to be an autism spectrum disorder. Because of its close association with autism, hyperlexia is often misdiagnosed. The main characteristics of hyperlexia are an above normal ability to read coupled with a below normal ability to understand spoken language.
