Unwarranted police violence and the physical mistreatment of citizens are not uncommon in the history of U.S. law enforcement. Empirical and anecdotal evidence supports the "shoot first and ask questions later" philosophy held by many police officers until the early 20th century, when the criminal justice system began to pay closer attention to issues of police brutality (Fitzgerald, 2007).
