The surface of eggs laid by wild backyard birds have a remarkably wide variety of textures. Many of them are smooth, but just as many can be covered in tiny dimples or feel pebbly. Some wild backyard bird eggs have ridges and ripples. Eggs can also be glossy or have a duller, matte finish.

Starling eggs Sturnus vulgaris (above) Starling eggs are smooth and fairly glossy, 30 x 21mm in size. They are pale blue eggs with no markings. They are sometimes found whole, with unhatched eggs, largely due to infertility. Starlings nest in colonies, with all individuals feeding in a communal foraging ground.

In general, bird egg shells are made of calcium carbonate and so the default colour is white. But other pigments can create different colours and patterns. Birds that build their nests in trees and shrubs (like dunnock and blackbird) generally have blue or greenish eggs, either spotted or unspotted.

How To Identify Bird Egg Shells - Woodland Trust

Look at the size, shape, and color of the eggs, if present. The size of the eggs is related to the size of the parent, so small eggs will belong to small birds and large eggs to larger birds. Egg shape can also give important clues about the lifestyle of the layer.

The herring gull prefers to lay eggs in sheltered ground or roof locations with minimal nest construction, though parent birds will line the nest site with weeds, grass, or seaweed. The eggs can vary from a gray or brown hue to a faint blue or green; they are marked with brown, lavender, or black streaks and spots.

The bulk of the egg laying activities begin in March although breeding can take place considerably earlier, especially in the southern part of the state. By March thousands of wood storks are nesting in scattered colonies across the state, most notably at the Audubon Society's Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary.
