1. Back Stitch. This makes a very strong hand stitch. If you do not know anything learn this; you can sew anything. Pull the needle through the fabric, Take a stitch downwards, then go forward the same distance beyond the first stitch to bring the needle up again. Bring the needle down to the start of the first stitch.

10 {EASY} Hand Stitches you should learn for perfect sewing.

The running stitch is one of the most common and basic stitches you can do, both by hand and by machine. Sewing by machine assures precision and firmness. But, sewing by hand is great for a speedy stitcher and quick stitches and for stitching together narrow spaces that cannot be reached by machine.

Basic steps for creating a basting stitch: Thread a hand sewing needle and knot the thread. Stitch through the fabric to the backside, skip a small distance, and stitch back up to the right side. Repeat the stitch in a straight line for the distance needed. Sew one or two stitches in place at the end of the area you want to be basted.

Running Stitch A very short, even stitch for fine, permanent sewing purposes. Directions: Weave the point of the needle in and out of the fabric by using very short (1/16"), even stitches before pulling the needle through the fabric. Running Stitch Video Hint: Start in upper left corner and go from left to right.

The feathered chain stitch is a decorative hand embroidery stitch that utilizes detached chain stitches arranged in a zig-zag pattern as if working the feather stitch, forming a hybridized stitch. This highly textured surface embroidery stitch is wider than a standard chain stitch, making it

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perfect for use in wide bands and rows.

Basic Sewing Stitches for Beginners

Everyone should learn these foundational sewing stitches, as they're necessary for everything from making small repairs to crafting full garments—and all of them can be done by hand. You might think that sewing by hand takes much longer than sewing by machine. While that is sometimes true, it's often faster to pick up your needle and thread than it is to set up a tabletop of equipment.

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
