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Maps And Legends Reading Writing

Refer to the legend (also called the Map Key) to make sense of the map. In addition to a compass rose, many maps also contain a legend, or chart that explains the scientific methods used to draw up the map and lists what important symbols mean. Familiarizing yourself with the legend is key to comprehending the way the map displays information.

Writing Legends

Find local businesses, view maps and get driving directions in Google Maps. When you have eliminated the JavaScript, whatever remains must be an empty page. Enable JavaScript to see Google Maps.

Inform students that maps usually have titles, as you point to the top of the map. Ask students to say aloud the title of this map. Tell students that they will look at the Town Map to gain practice in identifying symbols and reading a compass rose and map key. Ask students to point to the compass rose on the worksheet.
