

Mozart Piano Concerto 20 Analysis

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However, according to Leopold's report, at the first performance of Piano Concerto No. 20 in D Minor (K. 466), Mozart, who was the soloist and conductor, used his own piano, equipped with a pedal-board. Presumably the pedal-board was used to reinforce the left-hand part, or add lower notes than the standard keyboard could play.

Early Mozart concertos. Concertos Nos 1–4 (K.37, 39, 40 and 41) are orchestral and keyboard arrangements of sonata movements by other composers.The next three concertos (K. 107/1, 2 and 3), which are not numbered, are arrangements of piano sonatas by J.C. Bach (Op 5.Nos. 2, 3, and 4, all composed by 1766). Based on handwriting analysis of the autographs they are believed to date from 1771–72.

Piano Concerto No. 20 in D Minor, K. 466, was given its première in Vienna on 22 February 1785, with the composer at the piano. His cadenza is lost and the first published cadenza we have was from Beethoven himself, who liked this concerto and kept it for many years in his own concert repertoire.

Like the majority of the piano concertos Mozart composed in Vienna, the F Major concerto, No. 19, was written for his own use, possibly at an Advent concert in December 1784. The extant autograph score gives no date of composition, but Mozart entered the concerto in his thematic catalog on 11 December of that year. He would also likely have included it along with another new concerto, K. 466 ...
