A Test for Assessing Phonemic Awareness in Young Children.

Phonological awareness lets kids recognize and work with the sounds of spoken language. In

preschoolers, it means being able to pick out rhyming words and count the number of syllables in a name. It also involves noticing alliteration (how sounds repeat themselves).

What Is Phonological Awareness? - Understood

In the typical training study design, children who lack phonemic awareness skills are randomly divided into different groups, one receiving training designed to develop phonemic awareness skill and the other receiving training designed to develop a skill that is unrelated to reading (say, a mathematical skill like counting).

The Importance of Phonemic Awareness in Learning to Read ...

The first signs of phonemic awareness usually appear in children between the age of two and three years old when they begin making rhymes out of words that they know. For example, children may sing, recite rhymes, or make a game out of saying words like “sat, fat, cat, rat, bat, at.”
