Section 37D of the Pension Funds Act does permits certain deductions from a member's retirement fund benefit. These are: Amounts due in respect of housing loans, granted by the fund/employer or for which the fund/employer agreed to stand surety;

Section 37D(1)(b) contains strict requirements, which must be complied with before a Fund may deduct or withhold a member's benefit. Funds have become stricter - quite reasonably so - and will not easily make deductions or withhold a member's pension benefits in the absence of strict compliance with the section 37D(1)(b) and its Rules.

Claims against pension funds are permitted by law, but as two of the latest Tribunal determinations show, it must meet strict requirements. Section 37D of the Pension Funds Act does permit certain deductions from a member's retirement fund benefit or pension pay-out.

PERMISSIBLE DEDUCTIONS FROM PENSION BENEFITS

Section 37D of the Pension Funds Act The section provides two instances when a fund may deduct amounts from a member's benefit. These are: 1. When the member owes the fund or his employer money for an outstanding housing loan given by the fund or the employer or where the fund or employer provided a guarantee

The court further held that "the registered pension fund" referred to in s 37D(1)(b) of the Act must be construed as a reference to the pension fund of which the ex-employee was a member at the time of his employment, namely, the fund which the employer participated and not some other fund to which the pension fund benefits may subsequently have been transferred.

Breaking the golden egg - the pitfalls of written ...

Section 37D (b) (i) of the Pension Funds Act allows for compensation in respect of damage caused to the employer by reason of a member's theft, dishonesty, fraud or misconduct to be deducted from the benefit payable to the member in terms of the rules of the retirement fund.

Pension Funds Amendment Act 11 of 2007 Section 37D (1)(e): "for the purposes of section 7(B)(a) of the Divorce Act, the pension benefit referred to in that section is deemed to accrue to the member on the date of the court order: Provided that-(i) such deduction shall be effected by the pension fund named in the order upon receipt of the order;

4. Amounts that may be deducted from member's benefits - Section 37 (D) Section 37D specifies the deductions permitted by the Pension Funds Act. A registered fund may deduct the following amounts from the benefits payable to a member from an approved pension or provident fund: Tax/ arrear tax:
