Laws that forbade sheepmen to herd sheep on the open range were ineffective because no representatives of the General Land Office were located in West Texas to delimit the open range. A law of April 1883 called for a certificate of inspection to show that sheep were free of scab before they could be moved across a county line.

With the emphasis now on wool, a new market was found among the woolen mills in New England. In the period of the Republic of Texas and afterward, sheep ranching expanded into the hills and plateaus north and west of San Antonio. Purebred sheep were introduced in the 1840s and 1850s by Germans and Scots. During that same period many sheep were brought from the Midwest and the Ohio valley.

Romero and most of his followers remained in the vicinity until the late 1880s and 1890s, when most of them drifted with their sheep back to New Mexico. The few who remained switched to cattle. After 1875 large ranches dominated the area, and Tascosa became the shipping and supply point for the LIT, LX, LS, Frying Pan, and XIT ranches. Henry Kimball, the first Anglo settler in the Tascosa area, set up his blacksmith shop in 1876.
