Canada has a criminal statute of limitations only for summary conviction offenses, for example, causing a disturbance, trespassing and falsifying employment records. Under Section 786(2) of the Criminal Code of Canada, a law that codifies most criminal offenses and procedures in Canada, the statute of limitations extends for a six-month period after the criminal act was committed.

These 3 types of offences are set out in the Criminal Code of Canada. Purely summary conviction offences. The list of summary conviction offences is set out in section 553 of the Criminal Code. These are the most minor charges compared to indictable and hybrid offences. Examples include theft (under \$5,000) and mischief charges.
