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The Government High Line Canal

The functional Government High Line Canal, also known as the Grand Valley Project, runs along the settled northern edge of the Grand Valley near Grand Junction, Colorado. The canal was built by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and is owned by the federal government, through authorization of the

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1902 Reclamation Act.

The High Line Canal is a man-made waterway, used for irrigation and recreation, that serves the Denver-Aurora metropolitan area. It begins at a diversion dam on the South Platte River, some 1.8 miles above the mouth of Waterton Canyon. From its headgate, the HLC runs generally northeast for 66 miles, passing through Douglas, Arapahoe, Denver, and Adams Counties. The High Line Canal—a 71-mile-long former irrigation conveyance turned greenway and stormwater filtration tool—winds its way through the Denver metro area as an artery of infrastructure boasting a story of adaptation. The canal, built in the 1880s to move irrigation water, was purchased by Denver Water in the 1920s.

The Government High Line Canal was started in 1902 and completed in 1917, after delays caused by private landowners whose land needed to be condemned to make the project possible. The Canal is 55 miles long and carries 1,675 second feet (s/f) of water.

There is a disconnect in the trail before it continues along on the east side of Plum Creek, adjacent to railroad tracks, crosses Santa Fe and then winds through the NW corner of Highlands Ranch. In

The High Line Canal cuts through the Denver Metro Area, from Waterton Canyon to Green Valley Ranch. “You go through different character zones. You go from the mountains up at Waterton Canyon, where you can see big horn sheep and snakes. Then you get into what we call the wooded village and the rolling foothills.

The trail follows the High Line Canal, a water utility that brings water from the South Platte River to contract holders for South Platte River water.
