Stages of Psychosocial Development. Erik Erikson's psychosocial development theory proposes that our personality develops through eight stages, from infancy to old age (Erikson, 1958, 1963).. He argued that social experience was valuable throughout life, with each stage recognizable by the specific conflict we encounter between our psychological needs and the surrounding social environment.

Psychosocial Development. A n adolescent has four tasks to accomplish to become a well-adjusted adult. These tasks are categorized as: 1) independence, 2) body image, 3) peer relations, and 4) identity. Adolescence is divided into three periods; early (ages 12-14), middle (ages 15-17) and late (ages 18-21).Some teens will develop faster in one task than others.
